


Fig 1. Total participants of the survey 1.

The figure shows the different percentages from the participants but almost 63% shows yes and 34% as no and 3% as maybe. This shows the interest for the fulltime eLearning from the participants.

Q5. Is English is easy to teach/learn through the e-learning tools?

Almost 70% of the participants as yes, 23% as no and 7% showed the efficiency of the eLearning tools that applied for the fulltime eLearning.

Q6. Do you think e-learning gives you more resources and easy access to the study materials?

This figure shows again most of the participants given yes ,18% as no and 4% as maybe. This gives positive results for the question because King Khalid University offers E-library facility to everyone.

Q7. Can you able to understand virtually everything heard or read?

It is clear 81% participants showed yes, 19% as no. This result is achieved by the help of eLearning tools where the student can access the resources in multiple way.

Q8. Do you get the same benefits as like traditional way (face to face) of teaching/learning?

VI. CONCLUSION
